Instructions and checklist

People

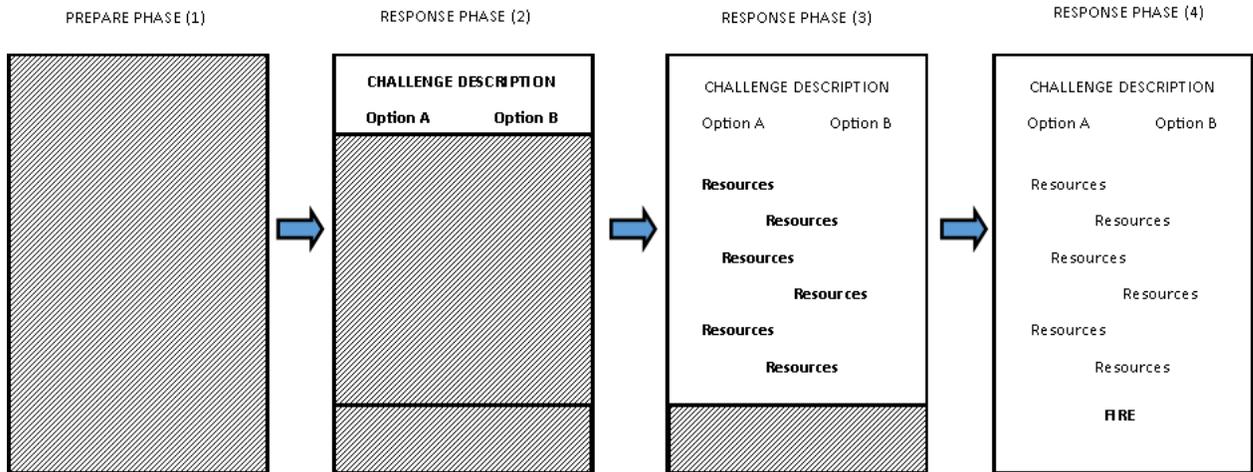
- 1 facilitator who has read the script and instructions ahead of time
- 12-48 players
- 1-2 helpers to assist the facilitator (OPTIONAL, but useful especially for larger groups)

Room

- 1 room large enough to fit all players
- 6 tables with enough chairs to seat all players. (Round tables are best, but feel free to improvise)
- A projection screen, connected to a device that can project a PowerPoint file.

Printed Materials

- Print Resource cards on sticky notes (further instructions in the Resource cards folder). Players use resource cards when solving their community challenge.
- Print Sectors (8.5x11in paper size) and place them somewhere in the room where players will meet with their colleagues from the same sector. Place the Sectors far enough apart so that players have enough space.
- Print Sector description, fold in the middle of the paper, and place on tables corresponding with Sectors. There are 6 sectors to which players are distributed in at the beginning of the game.
- Print Communities (8.5x11in paper size) and place them in the same spot as the Sector signs. There are 6 different communities. Players go to their communities after they finish the first part (prepare phase) of the game.
- Print Rule sheets (6x) and Resource descriptions (36x, or one for each player). These will provide players with detailed information about the various parts of the game. Prepare phase packet for each resource that includes sector-specific resource cards, prepare phase rules, and resource description sheets.
- Print Script and Instructions. This document will lead you through the game.
- Print Challenge boards on large paper (24x36in). See the diagram below to get more information about the challenge boards. Keep these hidden from players (1) until later in the game (after prepare phase). You can either stick them on a wall or use easels to hold them once that time comes Hide the part of the board that indicates what resources player will need to solve the challenge (2). That way they can focus on the challenge description and select which option they want to solve. Fold/hide the Fire! Section (3) so it is not visible when players reveal the resources they need to solve the challenge (it will be revealed during the Response phase – see Script and Instructions (4)).



Make a package for each player (shown in table below):

- a. Print Role descriptions (1x) and Community description (6x) and cut into individual pieces indicated by dashed lines
- b. Print nametags on name badge labels. Nametags should include blank line for name of the player, their role, sector either printed or indicated by a color matching the color scheme used in the game, and community name. The table below indicates which roles come from which sectors and communities.

Note: The optimal number of people is 36 (6 people in each sector and each community). However, you can play the game with 12-48 people and adjust the number of roles. Always try to evenly distribute the players in sectors and communities. Regardless of the number of people, all players still select 12 resources in each sector that they want to keep. In that way, the pool of resources for solving the challenges remains constant. If you do not have a number of players that is a multiple of 6, you will end up with more people in certain sectors and communities. That is not a problem, some people and sectors will end up with more resources, which will even out during the trading process when solving the challenges. You can even make a discussion point out of it, i.e.: “You who had less resources available in the beginning of the game, were you able to solve your challenge? Did you get help from other communities?”. With more than 36 players, feel free to duplicate some of the roles but try to distribute additional players evenly in various sectors and communities.
